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WHAT OUR STUDENTS SAY!

One of the most beautiful and impressive waterfalls in Bali is the Sekumpul waterfall. Together with the Fiji waterfall, this creates a breath-taking view when you look out over these 3 waterfalls.

After a walk of around 15 minutes, you will have this wallpaper view with all green and nature and the peaceful sound of the water smashing onto the rocks while you hear some birds whistling. Walking all the way down to the waterfall itself takes around another 15 minutes. Here, you will be rewarded with a cold and fresh dive into the water.

TIPS: Wear water-resistant shoes! With these, you can walk easily over the rocks. Take around one part of the day to visit this waterfall. It is really impressive, so you don't want to rush this.



The Waterfall is located around 20 minutes from Bedugul on the way to Singaraja in North Bali.

LANGUAGE COURSE BAHASA
